Celebrant: Worship and praise belong to you,
Father, in every place and at all times.

You sustain in being all that is.

In Christ your Son our life and yours

are brought together in a wonderful exchange.

He made his home among us

that we might for ever dwell in you.

Through your Holy Spirit

You call us to new birth in a creation restored by love.

As children of your redeeming purpose

we offer you our praise,

with angels and archangels and the company of heaven,

singing the hymn of your unending glory:

All:

Holy, holy, holy Lord,

God of power and might.

Heaven and earth are full of your

glory.

Hosanna in the highest.

Celebrant: Glory and thanksgiving be to you, most loving Father,
for the gift of your Son born in human flesh.
He is the word existing beyond time,

He broke the bonds of evil and set your people free
to be his body in the world.

And we look for the coming of his Kingdom.
Made one with him, we offer you these gifts
and with them ourselves, a single, holy, living sacrifice.

Hear us, most merciful Father,
and send your Holy Spirit upon us
and upon this bread and wine,
that, overshadowed by his life-giving power,
they may be the body and blood of your Son,
and we may be kindled with the fire of your love
and renewed for the service of your Kingdom.

Help us, who are baptized into the fellowship
of Christ's body
to live and work to your praise and glory;
May we grow together in unity and love
until at last, in your new creation,
we enter into our heritage
In the company of the Virgin Mary,
the apostles and prophets,
and of all our brothers and sisters living and departed,
through Jesus Christ our Lord.
Through him, with him, in him,
in the unity of the Holy Spirit
All honour and glory are yours, almighty Father,
For ever and ever.
